DEVOLUTION

The Government has announced that devolution will bring opportunities, money and growth to our region - boosting people's quality of life for generations to come, and it has confirmed that Sussex and Brighton are on the fast -track to benefit.

It has now launched a devolution consultation to create a new Strategic Combined Authority and a mayor for the wider region of West Sussex, East Sussex and Brighton. This runs until 11:59pm on 13th April 2025 and can be found at www.gov.uk/government/consultations/ sussex-and-brighton-devolution

With the changes set to bring investment and extra powers from Government to Sussex and Brighton, Chichester District Council is encouraging anyone who lives and works in the region to give their views - so please make sure that you have your say. As a district council, we will look at the detail of the proposals and provide feedback to the Government.

The Government has also published more details on its plans and next steps for Local Government Reorganisation. Local Government Reorganisation is separate to devolution, but it links with the government's overall aims. The government wants all areas to have unitary councils across the country, with

each serving a minimum of 500,000 residents. For the Sussex area, this is likely to mean the creation of three new unitary councils. This would mean all of the existing councils merging into the new unitary councils. We have been asked to submit a detailed business case by 26th September and we are working together with all councils in Sussex to put forward a proposal that best serves our communities. The changes themselves may not be fully in place until 2028.



An old proverb - "a peck of March dust is worth a king's ransom" has certainly proved true for farmers this year as we have been able to make good progress on both farms ploughing, sowing and applying farmyard manure to the fields without damaging the soils.

Although March has been a dry month it has been quite cold, so grass growth has been slow but hopefully as the days lengthen and temperatures rise, we will see good growth of all crops by early April to provide plenty of nutritious grazing for our sheep and cattle. Indeed, the dairy cows at East Dean have begun grazing what little grass there is for a few hours each day from the third week in March.

This month will see our two flocks of sheep busy lambing. Most of the ewes are lambed outside while a few requiring closer attention, such as first time lambers and those carrying triplets or more are kept inside. Ben will be looking after the flock at East Dean and father and daughter team Nick and Amy will take care of the Goodwood flock.

The dairy at Goodwood is always a busy place with cows calving almost every day of the year. The pictures here show two of our team working on the weekend shift - Amelia in the parlour milking the Shorthorn cows and Rosie giving the young calves their milk.

It's a joy to see and hear all the wildlife emerging across the farm now Spring is here. You may have noticed a good number of hares running around the open fields and may even be lucky enough to catch some pairs boxing. You can hear the skylarks singing overhead on the downs and a myriad different songbirds warbling away in the trees and hedgerows. Spring is truly a special time of year!

A key area of 4Sight Vision Support is their expertise as an Accessible Technology Service, to help clients with daily tasks following sight loss.

Equipment such as magnification tools or adapted lighting may at first spring to mind, but every day more technologies are becoming available which can be adapted to support varying needs.

For example, a Smart Speaker can access news, weather forecasts and talking books; set alarms and reminders, and manage a daily calendar. A wide choice of phone apps can access public transport information, read written documents to you and control your central heating remotely. Other technologies can help monitor emails, convert text to audio, and by scanning codes using apps such as Navilens, provide information on food packaging, public signage and public transport to name a few. The built-in screen reader on a TV will provide information about what programmes are audio described, and settings on a PC screen can adjust the display to suit those with impaired vision.

It has been a busy start to spring so far, with 'baby



Baby mammals that have been separated from their mothers must receive specialist-milk formulas around the clock to ensure they obtain the correct nutrients and do not become sick, so it is vital that they are immediately brought into the care of specialised wildlife rehabilitators like Brent Lodge if they are to have any chance of survival. Baby wild birds and reptiles also need specialist care. Did you know that some babies, such as goldfinch chicks, can need feeding every 5 -10 minutes?!



LITTERING SCUM!

Three weeks ago we had a village tidy day, so to do our bit Tim Watts and I went litter picking up East Dean Hill. In the course of an hour or so we gathered two black bin bags full of drinks cartons, takeaway food containers, bottles and cans – Red Stripe seems to be in fashion at the moment, presumably because it gives the people who drink it the energy to fling the empty out of the car window with zest and gusto!

We also found a van load of broken fragments of corrugated asbestos roofing panels which someone had thoughtfully decided to enhance the National Park with and, wrapped in a blue bag artfully tied in a bow, a nappy. Well, it's never too early to start teaching your children that the rest of the world is put there for them to dump their ordure in!

Coming back down to the village we found out that Helen Bailie and Vicky Mudford had done the same job on the same road two weeks earlier and filled two sacks on that occasion. Knowing them, I don't think they missed a load. Then, three days ago, Stuart Collins and Clive Muller went over it again and came down with four bags, and that wasn't stuff that the rest of us had left for someone else to have the thrill of collecting.

A few years ago our then District Councillor Jane Chevis showed me a map on which someone had worked out, in a

series of expanding circles, how far from a McDonald's drive-thru the food would be finished and the containers discarded. Unfortunately if you put the point of the compass on the Portfield branch and draw rings outwards they fall on the top of East Dean Hill and the Triangle car park at the top of Knights Hill.

There are obvious punishments for the offenders, ranging from the mild (put them in pink hi-viz waistcoats with "Littering Scum" written on them and force them to pick it all up) to the appropriate (put them in the stocks so people can chuck their mess back at them – that would work particularly well with the nappy) to the eugenic (sterilise them to weed their slovenly genes out of the population). But I can see the softies having objections to all of them. So how about this:-

When I was a child (back in the good old days, although we didn't know they were the good old days at the time) lemonade came in half-pint bottles that had a 3d deposit on them. So you never saw discarded bottles because if you found one that was as good as finding a 3d bit lying on the ground! (At the time my pocket money was 6d a week, 2.5p in modern money, that's how long ago the good old days were.) Obviously we would need to scale up to current values, but if there was a £1 deposit on all the drinks cartons and burger husks redeemable at any branch of the chain that sold them, how quickly would that change people's behaviour? Nobody goes around chucking pound coins out of their windows, and if they did there would be a clear incentive for enterprising children to pick them up and turn them into ready cash, just as me and my contemporaries did in the 1960s. This would be particularly effective on motorways, where fast food cartons bought in one services could be traded in at another service area further along. Because if you are ever in a hold-up on a motorway and you look at the litter on the verges it is absolutely appalling! *Tim Weeks*





PROTECTING THE RIVER LAVANT: A LONG-TERM VISION FOR RESTORATION

The River Lavant is a rare winterbourne chalk stream, beginning its journey at East Dean on the Goodwood Estate and flowing approximately 15 miles through West Dean, Lavant and Chichester before reaching the sea at Chichester Harbour.

Chalk streams are a unique and fragile habitat, fed by underground aquifers that filter the water, making them incredibly clear and nutrient-rich. They support an abundance of wildlife, including trout, eels, kingfishers, and water voles. However, these ecosystems are also highly sensitive to pollution, habitat loss, and changes in water levels and in recent years, we've seen a worrying decline in the health of the Lavant. Water quality has deteriorated, biodiversity has suffered, and seasonal flooding continues to pose a risk to local communities.

To address these challenges, Goodwood has partnered with West Dean and sought expert advice from the Western Sussex Rivers Trust, an independent charity dedicated to restoring local waterways. Their insights, combined with a River Condition Assessment Report commissioned by the South Downs National Park, have provided valuable guidance on how to improve the river's health.

We are now developing a long-term, landscape-scale restoration plan with the Western Sussex Rivers Trust. This will focus on nature-based solutions, such as restoring natural riverbanks, improving vegetation cover, and



reducing pollution sources. These interventions will not only enhance habitats for wildlife but also help reduce flood risks for our local villages.

Currently, we are reviewing proposals from professional river restoration specialists to determine the most effective solutions. Alongside this, we are gathering essential data on past and present flooding patterns. To support this, we are calling on local residents to share any photographs of flooding in East Dean, Charlton, or Singleton, along with the dates they were taken. This information will help us build a clearer picture of the river's behaviour and inform future conservation efforts.



Included in the forensic marking kits is a liquid made up of a unique DNA code containing thousands of microscopic identification dots. Once applied to tools and equipment, the indelible liquid dries clear, cannot be scratched off and can only be identified through UV lights and specialist microscopes. Each tool or piece of equipment is then marked in a secure register so that, if theft occurs, police are able to identify the goods as stolen and then reunite them with the owner.
