DEVOLVED AND DRY

Devolution of Local Government

Henry Potter, CDC Councillor for Goodwood Ward

There is too little known about this plan to "empower" local 1st and 2nd tier authorities to devolve from central government. This plan is not new as it was proposed by the previous Conservative administration but due to a distinct lack of enthusiasm for devolvement and amalgamation of LA's it was shelved.

Proposals and policies have only just started to be reviewed and because all we have at the moment is a timeframe, what will happen to the 'nuts and bolts' is largely a black hole! The suggested timeframe will be hard to adhere to simply because a lack of detail.

Just as an example, Chichester District Council has for a number of years been a very well managed council, in fact a couple of years ago it was rated the 4th best managed council in England.

Dry weather threatens 'exceptionally low' rivers in parts of UK

This BBC News article discusses the exceptionally low river



levels in parts of the UK due to a dry spring, the driest in England since 1961. Concerns are rising among farmers, water companies, and environmental agencies about potential droughts and water restrictions.

The dry weather has already impacted agriculture, with farmers irrigating crops earlier than usual, potentially leading to food shortages. Wildfires have also affected a larger area of the UK. While the UK is at medium risk of drought, the next few weeks are crucial.

Water companies are considering restrictions, and the government is urged to invest in long-term solutions. Water UK proposes a national water grid, and farmers seek support for reservoirs.

The article touches on a potential link to climate change. While a direct link is unconfirmed, studies suggest the UK may experience more prolonged dry periods and less rainfall, exacerbating droughts. The last drought in 2022 and subsequent measures are mentioned.



It has achieved this by very careful management of its finances, investments in income generating real estate, industrial and retail and an extremely good team of officers. Prudent spending ensuring best value for you, the council tax payers has been paramount.

CDC has assets of £144 million in income generation property, Terminus Road, Quarry Lane, St James industrial site, the Portfield retail parks, many shops and stores in the city, the three leisure centres, The Bourne, Westgate and the Grange in Midhurst, all of which help to keep your council taxes lower than elsewhere. The total rent roll is just above £3 million, the industrial properties bring in £1.17 million per annum, the retail and office £1.44 million. Income from general licences issued by the council is £64,500 per annum. You must agree, this is a very healthy portfolio for a district of circa 128,000 residents.

I am very concerned about what will be the future for our finances once they are absorbed by a new devolved unitary authority serving the proposed 500,000 residents of each new authority, and at the moment nobody has any idea! The diligence and prudence shown by CDC over the past 25 plus years is likely to be lost and I can see continued cuts in government grants to local authorities being met by increased "local taxes" from our pockets.

Finally I must add, how can an elected mayor, and how many officers(?) oversee the management of our police force and our fire and rescue service as well as infrastructure and highways. This must surely be a backward step.

We have been 'promised' a public consultation on the proposals by September this year, so you must make your concerns, like mine, known.





VE80 in East Dean

At 8am on the 8th of May Glenn Ward, Justin Pollard and Adrian Murphy set about building a beacon on Court Hill overlooking East Dean.

They were making it out of branches that were left on the edge of the woods following the ash die-back clearance a few years ago, which had been gathered into a pile by John Holt the previous day.

By the time I joined them they already had a wig-wam taking shape, trimming the longer bits to more manageable lengths with a chainsaw.

Then Josh Collins and Rachel Collins (who aren't actually related, but there's only so many names to go round) came up and together we set about packing the structure with smaller bits of kindling.

Josh took over with the chainsaw and set about cutting slices off a large log that had been too awkward to use earlier, looking oddly like he was making a set of coasters! But in they went, slotting into the gaps until by 9.30 in the morning we'd built what we knew would be an impressive fire. The one person who wasn't there was Tim Calloway, for many years East Dean's chief bonfire builder, but he was in all our thoughts as we cracked on with the job.

Meanwhile, down in the village Les Calloway, Alexia Ward, Jo Stephens, Sam Hook, Susie Holmes and Sarah Peirson were baking Orange and Ginger cakes, to be cut into slices and enjoyed by everyone later in the evening.

I got the lanterns out that Helen Bailie and Kate Shaw made for the Diamond Jubilee in 2012, but finding we only had 42 left set about making another 18, using up all the jam jars that I'd carefully horded knowing they would come in one day. Next door Helen Scott, who had printed all the flyers we'd distributed a week earlier, got busy printing 60 song sheets.

In the Star & Garter Jim, Julie, Jake and their team were working out how they were going to accommodate the 60+ people who'd booked for the wartime – inspired pre-beacon supper. The pub regularly handles more than 60 covers for lunch or dinner, but not normally all in one sitting. In the end the only way to do it was three long tables, creating a street party feel which was entirely appropriate!

And so, at 7pm, with the pub packed and everyone tucking into cabbage soup, fish and chips and bread and butter pudding, Alexia, Glenn and Neil Georges took tables from the Village Hall and went up the hill with the cakes and 12 bottles of Prosecco that Neil personally contributed.

At 8.30 the crowd left the pub and joined the children and everyone else at the hall, where Helen Scott lit the tea lights in the lanterns and set off the procession up to the beacon. John Holt hitched up a tractor to an open trailer with bench seating and drove anyone who couldn't manage the climb up there - when we do an event in East Dean we don't leave anyone out!

At 9.15 Neil (as Chairman of the Parish Council) welcomed everyone before handing over to the Vicar (Sarah Manouche) who led prayers of thanks for those who fought in World War Two, and of hopes for peace in our own troubled time. Then, as Glenn lit the beacon, we sang God Save The King accompanied by Jeannie Esdaile (who normally plays the church organ) playing a battery powered keyboard that made a sound similar to a piano (but not so similar that the Bechstein company will be worried). The Vicar's sister Catherine acted as a human music stand for this, because whilst I'd thought of getting a table and a chair for Jeannie I'd forgotten that crucial detail. Undaunted, as the beacon lit up the night and illuminated the song sheets, we sang I Vow to Thee My Country, Land of Hope and Glory and (of course) We'll Meet Again.

Afterwards, as everyone trekked back down to their homes and beds, Rachel took it upon herself to gather up any abandoned lanterns and put them in the collection box at the end of the track. She did a good job: of the 60 we started the evening with we've got 59 back

And that's the sort of team it takes to put on an event like that. But what a team! And what an event! *Tim Weeks*



Huge progress has been made with improving the organ at St Andrew's Church West Dean.

The organ is rare, made by the Compton Organ Company. Unaltered since being fitted in 1936 it was showing its age and in need of some tender loving care!

Two fantastic engineers, Mark and Jackie, from South Coast Organs, based on the Isle of Wight, spent a full two days of their time lavishing much needed care and attention on cleaning and repairs. Parts of the organ had been attacked by moths leading to a deterioration in the sound, but the hard work undertaken by Mark and Jackie has remedied the damage and it now sounds wonderful!

All this work was not without cost, (approximately £1,600), but it is hoped that this new improved instrument can now be used for concerts of all types of music, to help the ongoing Standing the Test of Time appeal to raise money for repairs to the West Dean church tower. Plans for the works on the church tower are currently with the architect and will shortly go out to tender.

May has been a very busy, but by and large, successful month on the farms. We have now finished lambing our ewes on both farms and according to Nick, he has never known such a good lambing season in his long shepherding career. The fine weather has certainly been a great help for preventing lamb losses and grazing conditions have been ideal. We have taken the first cuts for silage from our grass, clover and lucerne leys with respectable yields considering the lack of rain this Spring.

The dairy herd at East Dean, which calves in the Summer and early Autumn, are now coming to the end of their lactation which means that this month we will begin drying them off so the cows can have a two-month rest before they calve and start all over again. This works well for us as the grass growth on our thin chalk soils slows down during the summer and is insufficient to feed the whole herd if they are all still milking.

We are very much hoping that this run of fine weather will soon break to give our crops and soils a good soaking which they so desperately need now.

Our grateful thanks are due to Stuart Collins (see photo) who has been working with us at Droke Farm since he left agricultural college over 40 years ago. Although now semi-retired from fulltime work he will continue to help during our busy periods on both Goodwood and

Droke farms. Stuart has given many years of loyal service with a special interest in operating and maintaining farm machinery including combine harvesters, numerous tractors of all makes, ploughs, drills, various types of cultivators, mowers, muck spreaders and feeders. A great team member, Stuart has spent the last year working alongside and passing on his extensive farming knowledge to Ben who will be taking over much of Stuart's previous role.



The Swifts have screeched their arrival announcing summer has begun! The pungent fragrance of Lilac and Wisteria is now being followed by the roses. It is time to give those "darling buds" a good feed with potassium heavy plant food such as Tomorite, Rose Tonic or similar. Make sure to dead head them to prolong flowering.

Some timely tips from our Valley Gardener, Jon Rogers

Prune deciduous shrubs after they finish flowering.

Feed annuals, vegetables and bedding plants weekly, again with a potassium heavy plant food. Keep watering preferably using rainwater from butts or tubs and mulch heavily to save on water. When growing plants from seeds, make sure the soil has a good and even tilth and is in a turgid state i.e. damp but not wet.
