


Hedges

Planning Permission at Halloween

At this time of year, with so many people dressing up as ghosts for fun, it's easy to overlook the harm that insensitive home alterations can do to members of the undead community.


Yet the conversion of a draughty attic into a study or extra bedroom will have a terrible impact on the grey lady or Edwardian schoolboy who's been quietly manifesting in it for decades, in some cases centuries! Likewise installing heating and lighting in a dank cellar can only disrupt the monks and Victorian prostitutes who died there, but have never actually left it. All too often the modern obsession with exercise can result in a careless exorcism!







Immediate Justice (IJ) pilot continues to see success in our county with over 310 referrals to

An individual was referred to Immediate Justice after receiving a Community Resolution. The individual worked with local charity and IJ partner, Making it Out (MiO) on one of their ongoing projects to improve the local community across three reparative sessions.

MiO have a workshop in Portslade which looks onto the 'Portslade Gassie', a small boat that played a pivotal role within the harbour opposite during the 20th century. Sadly, over time, this boat has been forgotten and covered in weeds.

MiO are keen to preserve our local history and have been working with our IJ referrals to clear weeds and surrounding shrubs that have engulfed the Gassie in order to restore a historical community space.

The individual referred spent a total of six hours clearing weeds around the boat, opening up space in the surrounding greenery and we hope that further referrals to MiO will continue to benefit this project.



personally, to the club, for the teams against Sussex Rangers. We continue to train on a Tuesdays and welcome any local lads looking for a team to join.






